Ozaukee County Fair Modified Youth Judging for 2020

(UPDATED June 26,2020)

As each family determines their level of comfort with the 4-H judging and exhibiting experience, they are free to choose not to exhibit at the Fair this year, with no penalty in present membership status or status to re-join 4-H in the fall.

- Youth (4-H) Entries are due by July 1. Youth (4-H) members must enter in 4-H, **not** open class. Classes that are not available for entries this year have been removed from ShoWorks, however they will still appear in the 4-H Premium Book.
- Projects that are in the Youth Exhibit Building will **not** be judged face-to-face.
- Projects will be judged in the Columbia St Mary's Ozaukee Center (the Curling Building) rather than the (Firemen's Park) Exhibit Building, which will allow distancing of judging stations and display areas.
- Projects will be dropped off at the Columbia St Mary's Ozaukee Center on Friday, July 24 and Saturday, July 25 from 10AM to 6PM. Social distancing measures will be observed in this process.
- Entry tags will be available outside the Columbia St. Mary's Building for pick up only during the days & times listed above. When you arrive to drop off your projects, you will need to pick up your entry tags outside the St. Mary's Ozaukee building (the curling building) and securely fasten the entry tag and form to your project. You are encouraged to bring your own tape and safety pins to attach entry tags.
- Additionally, each entry will require an accompanying form (already completed by the Youth Exhibitor), which will tell the judge information needed for judging. The form will ask basic information and allow the member to explain the steps, techniques and methods as well as details about how the item was made and what the Youth Exhibitor learned in the process. A photo of the Youth Exhibitor and project may be included (optional). This form will be available on the Ozaukee County Fair website, along with the additional required animal forms, and will need to be secured to the entry.
- Youth (4-H) Judging Schedule will remain on the same days as previously planned.
- Actual judging will be closed to the public, and items will be on display when the Fair opens at Noon on Wednesday, July 29th. Whether the building is open to the public during the Fair depends on measures taken to safely exhibit the entries in a socially distant manner, and the number of volunteers who are willing to supervise the display.
- All 4-H and Open Class Horse and Pony Animal Shows are cancelled. Exhibitors may enter an educational exhibit to be dropped off at the Columbia St Mary's Ozaukee Center on Friday, July 24 and Saturday, July 25 from 10AM to 6PM. Social distancing measures will be observed in this process.

- All 4-H and Open Class Rabbit Shows are cancelled. Exhibitors may enter and educational exhibit be dropped off at the Columbia St Mary's Ozaukee Center on Friday, July 24 and Saturday, July 25 from 10AM to 6PM. Social distancing measures will be observed in this process.
- Foods will only be exhibited as educational displays, with **no edible food exhibits allowed**. This includes maple syrup and honey entries. Therefore, no educational food entries will be judged on July 21, 2020, as originally scheduled, rather should be brought on Friday or Saturday.
- Cake Decorating classes which show the project work on **non-edible** displays will be allowed. Cake decorating entries must be on a disposable plate or in a box that can be disposed after the fair. We will be disposing of cake decorating projects after the fair. Members can pick up their ribbon and form that accompanies the project during project pick-up. Therefore, no cake decorating entries will be judged on July 21, 2020, as originally scheduled, rather should be brought on Friday or Saturday.
- Music project members can email a video, upload a video **no longer than 5 minutes** to YouTube, or put the music on a CD or jump drive. Informational form described above will need to accompany the project. (email to exhibits@ozaukeecountyfair.com)
- Robotics and Flying Drones project members who would normally do a live presentation, can email a video **no longer than 5 minutes**, upload a video to YouTube, or submit on a jump drive, or are encouraged to choose another class number. There will be no face-to-face judging (email to: exhibits@ozaukeecountyfair.com).
- Auctioneering project members can submit a video, upload a video to YouTube or submit a jump drive. There will be no face-to-face judging (email to: exhibits@ozaukeecountyfair.com).
- Clothing Revue entries may submit a video **no longer than 5 minutes**, upload it to YouTube, or submit a jump drive showing them modeling the garment they made to: exhibits@ozaukeecountyfair.com).
- Projects will be sorted by Club and family **after** the Fair and may be picked up on Monday, August 3 and Tuesday, August 4 between the hours of 1-7 PM. Social distancing measures will also be observed in this process.
- Exhibitors that are unable to bring or pick up their project(s) to the Fair in person must make their own arrangements with an alternative party. The Fair is not responsible for lost or stolen exhibits.

Please note that this is subject to change as guidelines and recommendations change.
